Energy efficiency views in western North Carolina

300 residents in western North Carolina served by one of four rural electric co-ops -- Surry-Yadkin, French Broad, Blue Ridge and Energy United -- or by Duke Energy answered an online survey conducted by Appalachian Voices via Facebook from April 25 to May 9, 2016.

- 89% say they at least sometimes have difficulty affording their monthly electric bill, with 25% saying it's always difficult and 23% saying it's often difficult.
- 60% say they have only invested a little or haven't invested at all in home improvements to reduce energy waste, such as air sealing, insulation, or energy efficient appliances or heating/cooling systems.
- **69%** say the main barrier to making upgrades to save on energy use are up-front costs. 36% say that taking on debt would also be a big concern.
- **80%** are open to learning more about a type of program in which the co-op or utility would pay the up-front costs for home energy efficiency improvements that are then repaid using a portion of the savings that result.
- **84%** say that reducing their electricity bills is a very important priority for them, and nearly 75% say they want to be more energy efficient. About 33% say generating some of their own electricity through solar or wind is important for them.
