48-Hour Notification of Aquatic Resource Activity

Dear Mr. Wright:

Under the "West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection Conditions Required for Issuance of Federal Permits and Licenses Requiring State Section 401 Certification (Permit No. WQC-21-0005)" dated June 8, 2023, condition 2 states the following:

"Second, we are requiring that MVP provide 48 hours' notice to the WVDEP before commencing any stream or wetland crossing activity. This notification allows State inspection personnel to use their resources efficiently to inspect high-priority crossings and to conduct unannounced inspections to verify compliance."

This letter is intended to provide you with 48-hour notice. On Spread F, in Summers County, MVP will begin prepping the site and bore pits for the trenchless crossing of Stream S-I8.
