- 1. Importance of Grant Writing
 - 1. More grants need to be applied for on behalf of the town
 - 1. Mary Darcy offered to write grants for the town
 - **2.**Terran offered for the organizations (namely, VO) to
 - partner with the town on grant writing
 - **3.**TCTAC
 - 4. Get on the agenda and offer to write grants for the

 - 1. People in BSG want the area to do well, and work hard to achieve this

Weaknesses of the County

- 1. Community Perspective
 - 1. Members of the community view the cost of living as unnecessary
 - 2. View grant money improperly
 - 1. Complain about town expenses without knowing it is grant money
 - 2. If it is grant money, view it as a way to get out of town funds/charges
 - 3. Old schools have better structures than the new ones
- 2. Water

- 1. There's a water shortage
 - 1. Mary Darcy was told 30 years ago that there was no way to store the water here
- 2.60% of the water put out every month is lost
 - 1. Lots of big leaks
 - 2. The leaks need to be found, but it's very expensive
 - 1. Need grant money for water/sewage
- 3. Exodus
 - 1. People are leaving the area and housing is intent on being more expensive
 - 1. Proposed housing valued at 250k
 - 1. Wanting to bring people in but unable to keep people here
 - 2. Litter is everywhere
 - 1. Relied on inmates and inmate labor
 - 1. Were unable to pay for trash pickup
 - 2. Devalues our communities
 - 3. People do not have curbside trash pickup
 - 1. Potentially from people having to take their own trash to the dump
 - 4. We need responsible land management
 - 5. Lack of Community and Respect for Each Other
 - 3.Loss of Physicians in Ballad
 - 1. Makes healthcare more difficult here
 - 2. Difficult to get proper coverage and EMS is lacking funding

 - 1. What UNITY will do:

1. Work on grant writing for the area.

- 1. Grants with the most funding to secure often apply to multiple counties
 - 1. Wise and Scott would likely be able to be applied for together
 - 2. The grant would have to be for a specific project
- 2. Travis Anderson is the grant writer for Appalachia
 - 1. Terran will try to pull him into this conversation
- 3. Garret is another great grant writer
 - 1. We will try to see if he can participate
- 4. Sharon Fisher would be a great person to invite
- 5. Adam would be a great person to invite

2. Hold a grant writing workshop (???)

- 1. Sit down with the localities to see what grant writing opportunities there are
- 2. Look to the people who are model grant writers as mentors for grant writing process
- 3. Seek to hold grant writing workshop to get local people involved in the process
- 4. Make sure people know project management and capacity is a necessary aspect to the grant process
- 5. "Leadership Development Investment"

- 1. Recycling Program
 - Farmer's Markets would be a good testing range for recycling
 Recycle egg and milk containers
- 2. Trash pickup
 - 1. Terran will see about getting community buy in for localities
 - 2. Emma will see about grant information on it
 - 1. Would help if there's a perception of incentive
 - 2. START IN APPALACHIA and then apply it to other areas
