Dear Secretary Bose,

I am writing to express my opposition to the proposed Tennessee Gas Pipeline, L.L.C. project under docket number CP22-493-000.

It is important that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission be thorough and accurate in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) it will produce for this project. Kinder Morgan intends to construct a 32-mile pipeline through Stewart, Houston and Dickson Counties in Tennessee. There are major environmental and cultural concerns that should be considered. The proposed pipeline would also create other environmental impacts, including those described below.

Geology and Soils:

The pipeline would cut a path through more than 130 wetlands and streams. The bedrock along the pipeline route is karst limestone, which is erodible. The disturbance from construction could cause creeks to reroute or even go underground, becoming inaccessible to the public, wildlife and livestock such as cattle that currently rely on that water.

Cultural Resources:

Construction of the proposed pipeline would also endanger cultural sites in our region like the Promise Land Heritage area and the historical Cumberland Furnace community — these areas are home to over 20 officially registered historic sites. There are also several Century Farms that are directly in the route of the pipeline path. The proposed pipeline would place numerous historic sites and homes within the impact zone or evacuation zone of the methane gas pipeline, leaving them vulnerable to leaks and deadly explosions.

Water Resources and Wetlands; Vegetation and Wildlife:

This pipeline would present risks to drinking water, recreation and aquatic life in the region. The immediate disturbance from construction, the resulting sedimentation or a spill could affect access to clean water, including for rural residents who rely on well or spring water and cannot switch to an alternate supply in the event of contamination.

In addition, the pipeline could impact several watersheds and endanger aquatic ecosystems that are habitat to hundreds of plants and animal species, including several species of freshwater mussels.

Threatened and Endangered Species:

The majority of the 32-mile proposed pipeline would span through Dickson County, Tennessee, where, according to Tennessee's Department of Environment and Conservation, there are 26 rare or endangered species of plants and animals [1]. They also list seven species for Houston County, and 36 for Stewart County. Some of the animals include the golden eagle, little blue heron, gray bat, Indiana bat, alligator snapping turtle and hellbender.

Greenhouse Gas and Climate:

Installing a methane gas pipeline and constructing two gas-fired units is a step in the wrong direction when we should be making significant movements to combat climate change. Trading one fossil fuel for another does not make sense, especially since methane, compared to carbon

dioxide, is a much more potent greenhouse gas. There are other clean energy options to consider that are more sustainable and environmentally friendly.

Environmental Justice; Air Quality, Reliability and Safety:

This pipeline would only supply gas to the Cumberland City Fossil Plant, which TVA wants to replace with two gas-fired units. A gas plant would force this community to endure more water and air pollutants, while providing a fraction of the long-term jobs that clean energy alternatives could provide [2].

Residents along the proposed pipeline route would be exposed to risks of leaks, explosions and pollution. In Dickson County, near the terminal in White Bluff, Tennessee, there was an explosion in 1992 that many residents remember well. It put the entire community at risk, not to mention endangering many first responders.

FERC should also consider how this pipeline could further increase the energy burden on low-income residents throughout the Tennessee Valley. TVA's reliance on gas has already increased electricity bills significantly this year. With readily available clean energy replacements for the Cumberland City Plant, a new pipeline is unnecessary.
