PURPOSE OF THIS GUIDE

The purpose of this guide is to provide you with the contact information for community agencies, non-profits and home energy repair companies that provide energy improvement services and/or funds for your home. Such services and/or funds may help improve the comfort and value of your home, reduce your monthly and annual utility costs, and ultimately reduce the ecological impact of your home.

Note that many of the agencies and organizations named provide many forms of assistance but this guide aims to identify assistance relevant to home energy efficiency only. However, we encourage you to pursue all services available in order to reduce your energy costs and use the savings for more pressing household needs.

HELPFUL TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Community Action Agency: A non-profit organization that represents multiple counties and offers services and assistance to encourage household self-sufficiency. Eligibility for such services is reserved for low-income families or individuals. Funding is provided by federal grants, foundations, and individual donors.

Weatherization: A service that enables residents to permanently reduce home energy costs through energy efficiency upgrades. By using energy efficiency, you can save up to 40% or almost \$400 on your annual energy costs. Not only does this save you money, you will improve your home's air quality and increase the value of your home. *Weatherization is almost always provided by your county's Community Action Agency.* Funding is provided by the U.S. Department of Energy.

Energy/Crisis Assistance: These monthly funds are available to low-income households when you cannot afford to pay a specific monthly utility bill and your utility risks being shut-off. There are many agencies, nonprofit organizations and civic groups that provide utility assistance in each county. You are usually required to submit a "shut-off notice."

- Performing an Energy Audit
- Performing tune-ups and repairs to heating and cooling systems
- Sealing major air leaks
- Installing insulation in attics, walls, and floors
- Sealing and insulating ducts
- Installing a smart thermostat
- Improving health and safety **conditions** by addressing carbon monoxide levels and combustion safety

Servicios De Climatization

Metas del Programa: Incrementar la eficiencia de energía a propietarios de viviendas o arrendatarios de escasos recursos económicos reducir su total de gastos de energía, mejorar su salud y seguridad, particularmente a ancianos, familias con niños deshabilitados, viviendas con altas cargas de energías o alto uso de energía.

Eligibility:

Families with **incomes below 200%** (see chart below) of the Federal Poverty Level or households that have received income from SSI or TANF a maximum of 12 months prior to weatherization are automatically eligible, regardless of income. The Weatherization Program prioritizes eligible families, **servicing the elderly**, people with **disabilities and families** with children first. Both homeowners and renters can receive Weatherization Services.

Weatherization services include:

- Caulking and/or weather-stripping windows and doors
- Insulate attics, walls and floor areas
- Replace rotten window sashes
- Wrap heating ducts
- Repair holes in the floor
- Repair or replace hot water heaters
- Carbon monoxide testing

Eligibility:

BROC provides free weatherization assistance to qualifying residents (elderly, handicapped, or low-income). The service will be provided to homeowners as well as those who rent. However, for renters, a landlord agreement must be signed. Also, a small contribution is required from the landlord. Priority is given to the needs of the elderly and disabled. Proof of income is required. Homeowners must provide a copy of their deed or landlords must provide two signed statements agreeing that the work can be completed.

Weatherization services include:

- Air sealing, caulking and weather-stripping
- Attic and floor insulation
- Heating and air conditioning system tune up/replacement
- Cleaning and tuning of central furnaces to improve efficiency
- Inspection, sealing and insulating duct work
- Water heater and pipe insulation
- Installation of energy efficient compact fluorescent bulbs
- Carbon Monoxide and smoke detector installation
- Refrigerator assessment and possible replacement

Eligibility:

Eligibility is based upon family size and income as published in the federal register. Currently the Weatherization Assistant Program operates at 200% of the Poverty Guidelines and the Heating Air Repair and Replacement Program operates at 150%. Interested persons should contact the W.A.M.Y. Community Action, Inc. office in the county they live to request an application or obtain additional information.

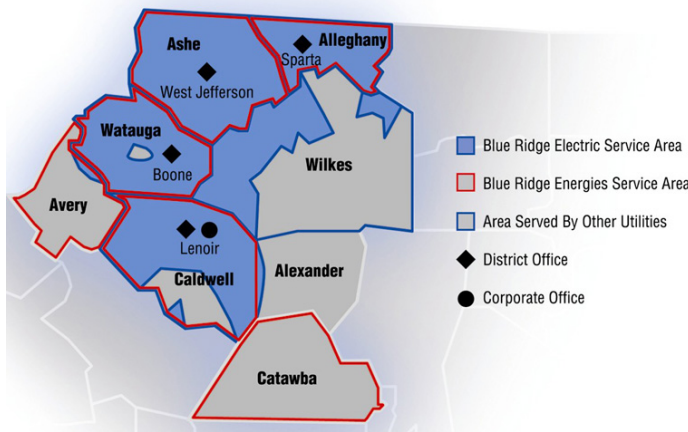

Funds available through:

- **Crisis Intervention Program**
Provides assistance for adults or families with children with heating or cooling related emergencies. Funds are available monthly on a first come first basis.
- **Emergency Assistance**
Provides assistance for families with children under age 18 in the household, and in an emergency situation. Funds may help pay rent, heating costs, electric bills, and other one-time necessary expenses. The assistance must alleviate the emergency. Families may receive this assistance once per year. Families must meet income and reserve guidelines.
- **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)**
Applications for LIHEAP are usually taken for two weeks in November of each year.

For any financially eligible family, with at least one member under age 18, that is experiencing a financial crisis involving heating, cooling, rent, etc. (financial guidelines subject to change)
- **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)**
Applications begin each December.
- **Crisis Intervention Program (CIP)**
For any financially eligible individual or family experiencing a heating or cooling crisis (financial guidelines subject to change).
- **United Way (UW)**
For any financial emergency where CIP or WFFA-EA does not apply or those funds are exhausted.

**DSS works with other agencies in the community to help relieve a financial crisis, such as Yokefellow, Salvation Army, South Caldwell Christian Ministries, Red Cross, and area churches.

LIHEAP aims to reduce households' utility costs through a one-time "cash benefit." While federally funded, it is administered by all NC counties' Department of Social Services. For services, contact your local DSS representative, found in the County Resources section of this guide. General LIHEAP information, qualifications, and benefits are provided below.

LIHEAP Income Eligibility Level

Heating/Cooling: 150% Federal Poverty Level

Crisis: 150% Federal Poverty Level

Under the law, LIHEAP grantees have the flexibility of serving households having at least one member who also receives assistance under any of the following Federal programs (referred to as categorical eligibility):

- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Supplemental Security Income
- Food Stamps.
- Certain needs-tested Veteran Benefits.

NC Housing Finance Agency

The N.C. Housing Finance Agency helps low-income homeowners who need comprehensive rehabilitation, urgent repairs, or energy-related home improvements through the Single Family Rehabilitation and Urgent Repair programs. Program funds are administered by non-profits and local government agencies based on funds available, condition of homes, and met eligibility. Contact your county's administrator to apply for SFR or URP.

1. Single Family Rehabilitation (SFR) Program

Eligible households may receive \$5000-\$45,000 in the form of no-interest, forgivable loans—forgiven at \$3,000 per year. Households' income must be below 80% of the area's median income.

2. Urgent Repair Program (URP)

Eligible households may receive funds in the form of deferred-interest, forgivable loans—forgiven up to \$8,000. Households' income cannot exceed 50% of the area's median income.
