- General thanks: this is a difficult time to be on the Commission, with electricity prices rising and demand growing, and we appreciate their efforts.
- Power Pair program order. Directed Duke to pay incentives to households to install solar panels plus battery storage. This has helped the utility learn more about how to use storage resources to bolster grid reliability and resiliency, and we look forward to the forthcoming commercial version of the program.
- Rapid prototyping. Directs Duke to quickly roll out and test pilot programs to speed up grid innovation. The working group has begun looking at potential pilots.
